This booklet provides a curated selection of local quality services and resources for for primary health professionals, including GPs and practice nurses managing childhood asthma.

It has been compiled to in response to feedback from the Improving Childhood Asthma Management - inner west Community of Practice.

Participants collectively identified the need for a resource that provided health care professionals with a quick guide to quality asthma management information in one place.

Patient education and medicine review

An Australian study found 6 out of 7 confident inhaler users thought their technique was correct when it wasn't. It's important to encourage paediatric patients and their families or carers to build their skills and knowledge. Consider referring them to a free, specialist education service such as those listed below:

cohealth Community Asthma Program

Refer to the free cohealth Community Asthma Program for families with children with asthma. An asthma nurse educator will work one-on-one with families via telehealth, in the clinic or during home visits. The service is available to inner west and inner north suburbs.

Home Medicine Review by pharmacist

Write a referral to a local participating pharmacy to arrange a <u>Home Medicines</u> Review (HMR). An accredited pharmacist will visit the patient's home to check medicine management, including inhaler technique, correct storage, tips for adherence.

Check if your patient is <u>eligible for a home</u> <u>medicine review</u>.

Asthma Australia referral service

Refer asthma patients over 3 years old to Asthma Australia to keep them on track between appointments. A qualified asthma educator will contact the patient or nominated adult and schedule a phone appointment to discuss asthma management.

Alternatively, you or your patient can make a booking online with an asthma educator.



Complex asthma care

For more complex, severe or difficult to treat asthma consider referral to these services, or to a local or hospital-based paediatrician.

Paediatric care in the community

Hospital-based services

Royal Children's Hospital Melbourne complex asthma clinic

Refer patients who meet the <u>referral criteria</u> to the complex asthma clinic via the complex <u>care hub</u> using the <u>external referral form</u>.

Royal Children's Hospital Melbourne Department of Allergy and Immunology

Refer patients with suspected allergy-triggered asthma who meet the referral criteria outlined in the asthma <u>pre-referral guideline</u> to the Department of Allergy and Immunology.

Western Health Hospital Admission Risk Program (HARP)

Refer patients at risk of avoidable hospital admissions and emergency department presentations who meet the <u>referral criteria</u> using the <u>community access referral form</u>.

Sunshine Hospital paediatric asthma and eczema clinics (Western Health)

Paediatricians can refer patients aged 0-18 years who meet the <u>specialist clinics' referral</u> guidelines.



Clinical management tools

An estimated 33 per cent of children with asthma aged 0–14 do not have an asthma action plan. This is despite good evidence that having a written asthma action plan consistently improves health outcomes.

Guidelines

Clinical practice guidelines for childhood asthma have been developed and maintained by the Royal Children's Hospital. They include:

Tools

Create an asthma action plan

Templates are available in commonly used medical practice management software such as Best Practice and Medical Director. You can also find commonly used asthma action plan template here:

Asthma action plans are required by schools and childcare providers when caring for a child or young person with asthma. Victoria's Department of Education asthma policy does not require special versions of asthma action plans (e.g., a 'school care plan') to be completed by GPs if an asthma action plan is provided. Plans can be provided in either colour or black and white.



TIP - An accessible asthma plan

When you upload a patient's Shared Health Summary to their My Health Record, include information that the patient has an active asthma action plan.

You may wish to advise patients or their carers with smartphones to take a photo of their or their child's plan so they have a copy accessible, and in colour to show the traffic light system, if needed. This has been trialled and found to be an effective intervention.

Consider suggesting uploading the asthma action plan to their My Health Record.



Self-management resources for patients

Regularly supported self-management <u>has been found</u> to be one of the most effective ways of reducing healthcare use in patients with symptoms of severe asthma.

Improving childhood asthma management in the inner west - online training course

RACGP: 1 CPD Activity Point

For general practitioners, nurses, pharmacists and allied health care providers.

This 1 hour online interactive education program is designed to meet the needs of health professionals living and working in Melbourne's inner western suburbs. The program, developed by National Asthma Council Australia, is available online on demand.

Participants will learn how to:

- Identify the steps involved in the diagnosis of paediatric and adolescent asthma.
- Identify asthma triggers and those triggers specific to the Inner West of Melbourne.
- Describe the management of asthma across the different ages in children and adolescents.
- Summarise the important information to be included in a Written Asthma Action Plan.
- Define the steps in managing acute asthma in primary care.

National Asthma Council Australia education and training workshops

National Asthma Council Australia (NAC) offers a <u>program of free asthma best practice</u> <u>education workshops</u> for primary health care professionals and allied health professionals.

Two training formats are available, face-to-face workshops and online webinars. These are facilitated by members of the NAC's team of respiratory experts, including asthma and respiratory educators, respiratory scientists, GPs and nurse practitioners.

Quality Improvement (QI)

QI templates, including those for paediatric asthma, are available for general practices to improve patient outcomes and deliver best practice care.

- 1. Increase the number of paediatric patients who have had a 6-monthly asthma review (moderate to severe asthma)
- 2. Increase the number of paediatric patients who have a complete asthma action plan.

Home medicines review - local participating pharmacies

GPs can refer to a local participating pharmacy to arrange a Home Medicines Review (HMR). An accredited pharmacist will arrange to visit the patient's home to check medicine management, including inhaler technique, correct storage and tips for adherence.
