#### Referrals

We have a range of resources to make things easier for GPs and other referrers. Support includes: information sessions run by our specialists; referral guidelines and forms; and information about our services.

#### Referral guidelines

Our referral guidelines provide information to assist GPs identify which patients to refer and when. They also outline key information required on the referral. The more clinical information that you include, the better we are able to triage your patient.

- GP's using Medical Director, Best Practice, Genie or ZedMed will be able to send referrals from within the patient record directly to Eye and Ear without printing and faxing





#### **Snoring and Obstructive Sleep Apnoea in Children**

#### **Background**

About snoring and obstructive sleep apnoea (OSA) in children ✓

#### Assessment

- 1. Take a history to assess severity:
  - Observed sleep symptoms ➤
  - Related symptoms ➤
  - Other ENT-related symptoms ➤

If history is incomplete:

- provide Obstructive Sleep Apnoea (OSA) ☑ fact sheet, and
- · advise carers to produce a short recording or video of their child's snoring and apnoea episodes.
- organise follow-up.
- Perform examination . Tonsillar appearance and size is less important than history as other nasopharyngeal factors such as
  adenoidal hypertrophy may be the primary cause of snoring and OSA.
- 3. Estimate severity of obstructive breathing during sleep
  - Mild ✓
  - Moderate
  - Severe ✓
- Investigations are not indicated.
  - · Overnight oximetry has poor sensitivity and is not required for assessment in the general practice setting.
  - Paediatric sleep services v are sometimes utilised if clinical assessment is difficult
  - Neck X-ray is not indicated.

#### Management

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- 1. Manage according to degree of obstruction:
  - Mild V: Advise carers to monitor child's symptoms, and to review if concerned.
  - Moderate ➤ and severe ➤:
    - ∘ Consider trial of intranasal steroids ∨ for 6 weeks and continue if improvement in symptoms.
  - Arrange non-acute paediatric ENT Referral providing relevant information on observed sleep symptoms 


     v to ensure accurate triage of referral.

  - In severe cases, advise upper respiratory tract infections can temporarily increase symptoms and consider providing a three day course of prednisolone, 1 mg/kg/day once daily for 3 days (max 50 mg).
- 2. Educate carers, depending on severity:
- Mild symptoms may resolve over time and a watch and wait approach is sensible.
